The 2024 Annual WUMC Holiday Outreach was a great success due to the incredible generosity of donors and partners. This year's program allowed us to assist 105 seniors, adopt 56 families and individuals. We partnered with the St. Louis Housing Authority to identify senior residents that we could assist during this holiday season. Each senior received a gift bag filled with essential household items including toiletries, warm blankets and a \$100 Walmart gift card. The St. Louis Housing Authority staff was on hand to work with the WUMC staff team to distribute the bags.

Our Holiday Outreach program was able to assist families within our service footprint with utility assistance and holiday gifts provided by our generous departments and local partners. The WUMC staff team worked tirelessly with department coordinators to match them with the right families in order to make their holidays a little brighter. The day that families showed up to receive their gifts, tears of joy flowed freely and ample hugs were given to the staff team as an appreciation from families and individuals receiving assistance this year.



56 families were adopted by **17** WashU and BJC departments, **two** nonprofits, and **one** private individual.



Donations

We were able to assist families in need with **\$2,350** in utility bill assistance.



Care Packages

We delivered personal care packages, holiday gifts, gift cards, groceries, and catered lunches to **105** lower-income seniors at a value of **\$16,960** above the program total.

Because of the generous donations received, every participant received a variety of gift cards to be used at their discretion.





Over **\$59,000** was donated by the outstanding members of our community to the Holiday Outreach program this year.
